## Handcoloured linocuts With Grace Glassish

Two-day workshop with Tasmanian landscape artist **Grace Gladdish**, covering her inspiration, creative process and use of materials. Grace will support participants to create their own handcoloured linocut, providing guidance through designing, carving, printing, and colouring. **Dates to be confirmed**

# Drypoint – Just like etching without the acid With John Robinson

Drypoint is an Intaglio process, using a sharp needle to scribe into a plate. Working with small plates, John will start with a recycled milk bottle, a plastic plate and finish with an aluminium or copper plate. This is a good introduction to printmaking, suitable for beginners or those who need a refresh of technique. John Robinson operates Moving Creature Studio in Lindisfarne and has an extensive background in Printing and Printmaking.

## **Cyanotype sun-printing** With Patricia Martin

Cyanotypes are one of the oldest photographic printing processes in the history of photography. Distinctive feature of the cyanotype print is its shade of cyan blue (Prussian Blue), which results from exposure of a specific mix of chemicals to ultraviolet light.

In this course you will learn how to make cyanotype sunprints from photo negatives and positives, plant material and a host of other 3-dimensional objects.

# **Reduction Linocutting** With Ange Cooper

These classes will cover an overview of Relief Printmaking and how to create a multi-colour print using the reduction print technique. It will be a step-by-step process from idea to final image discovering a different approach while creating an editioned print. This course is suitable for all stages of learning and new students will be assisted to progress at their own level and pace.
